## What is plagiarism?

 Appropriation of another person's ideas or words without giving credit or listing sources properly

 Most common reasons: "publish or perish", personal ambitions, poor education, vanity, financial pressure...

## What is plagiarism?

- Authorship ghost authors, guest authors, honorary authors...
- Citation styles proposed by publishers
- New technology plagiarism and its detection

# University of Rijeka

- Any form of falsification is unethical
- Plagiarism is infringement of the Code
- It is important to protect intellectual property rights of all members of academic community



# University of Osijek

- Plagiarism is copying other authors' words, ideas or results and presenting them as one's owns
- Inappropriate or biased use of citations, honorary and ghost authorship are unacceptable



# University of Split

- Fabrication, manipulation and plagiarism are not acceptable
- Plagiarism is copying other authors' ideas, words or results and presenting them as one's owns
- All the accusations of misconducts have to be proven



# University of Zagreb

- Any form of plagiarism is unacceptable (honorary, ghost authorship)
- All the members of academic community guarantee originality of their published works
- Intellectual property has to be protected



## University of Dubrovnik

- Academics should be stated as authors of only those works they really authored
- In the case of secondary publication of the same results, the original source should be cited



# University of Zadar

- It is unacceptable to use texts or ideas of other authors (including students) without giving credits
- It is unacceptable not to indicate all the references



# University of Pula

- Authors guarantee that they are authors of all their published papers
- Plagiarism is unethical


- All mention research misconduct

- 2 mention intelectual property rights
- 1 mention that accusation has to be proven





- Universities and scholarly journals' publishers should do their best to educate and inform their students, educators, scientists, authors

### Conclusion

 Scientists as users of scientific information should be able to detect plagiarism by recognizing false bibliographic references, using plagiarism detecting software, checking authorship of cited references and by evaluating publication and its publisher



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
